Want to play your part in equity-focused conservation education with diverse local communities? Ready to roll up your sleeves and work directly with youth to build the next generation of conservationists? Want to be part of a talented, deeply committed and national award-winning conservation organization? Then please read on!

Sonoma Land Trust (SLT) is looking for an energetic and detail-oriented program assistant to help implement community engagement and youth education programs. SLT serves a diverse audience with broad cultural heritages, socioeconomic backgrounds, genders and orientations. We encourage applications from candidates who reflect and value the audiences and populations we serve.

Overview

The Program Assistant is supervised and managed by the Bilingual Youth Programs Manager and assists the implementation of planned educational activities for youth program participants including the Students Learning in Marsh Environments (SLIME) school fieldtrip and Conservation Council youth development programs.

The position includes scheduling and facilitating in-person and virtual educational programs as well as supporting youth development activities with participants. Some programs are offered in Spanish, in which case this position will support program delivery by the Bilingual Youth Programs Manager. This position requires both traditional and remote work as well as weekend work as part of the regular schedule.

Primary Responsibilities

- Assist in coordinating and scheduling school field trips
- Conduct outreach to schools, teachers and administration in-person and/or virtually
- Conduct SLIME virtually through videoconferencing platforms (Zoom and Google Meets) and in-person
- Conduct SLIME pre-field trip classroom presentations at schools
- Assist the facilitation of in-person field trips to the Sonoma Baylands tidal wetlands
- Assist in conducting workshops, field days and outings for the Conservation Council
- Review and monitor data input for Conservation Council research
- Lead hands-on nature, science and team building games and activities
- Provide guidance, leadership and support to participants
- Track time for designated grants accurately
- Track schools and participant information in program database
- Track participant attendance and other data points for grants
- Provide safe and responsible transportation using Land Trust vehicles for program participants
- Other duties as assigned

Essential Qualifications

- High school diploma required; additional education and/or experience with environmental education, public recreation and/or nature-based programming preferred
- Bilingual in Spanish/English strongly preferred
- Background and/or experience in working with youth and group management with the ability to connect with young people in the classroom and outside of the school setting
- Ability to be outgoing, enthusiastic and motivational with participants
- An enthusiasm for nature and connecting diverse audiences to the outdoors
- Able to have positive and professional communication with school staff and colleagues
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively
- Ability to hike up to three miles per day over steep and rugged terrain and lift and carry up to 30 pounds
- Competency with computer operations, specifically Microsoft Office Word and Excel, Box and Google Drive in a Windows environment, and familiarity with internet use and video conferencing platforms
- Ability to work weekends and evenings
- Ability to work remotely
- Must pass the Live Scan fingerprint background check
- Current certifications in CPR/First Aid preferred
- Must have access to transportation and valid California driver's license

Schedule, Salary and Benefits:

Position is 30-32 hours/week – a part-time, seasonal, non-exempt position without benefits.

The wage for this position is \$21/hour.

This position is located at the Sonoma Land Trust office in Santa Rosa, California. Staff are working in a hybrid model. Field work is required, including on weekends.
