To achieve Sonoma Land Trust's mission of protecting the land of Sonoma County forever, we need an array of voices reflecting our community — a rich diversity of talent, backgrounds and beliefs — embodied in our organization, from board and staff to partners and supporters. In 2016, a group of six California land trusts, including Sonoma Land Trust, agreed to be *"early adopters"* of a California Coalition of Land Trusts' initiative to develop organization-specific Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DEI) plans. Our staff participated in retreats, coaching sessions and three years of committee work to produce a 10-year DEI plan, which was recently adopted unanimously by our board of directors last month. We're looking forward to continuing the work to ensure that our programs, land preserves and resources are shared equitably throughout the community.



Another successful year of Bay Camp!



It was a muddy but fun summer for campers who attended this year's Bay Camp. They all had an incredible time kayaking, biking and hiking through the newly restored wetlands at the San Pablo Bay National Wildlife Refuge, and learning about the importance of marsh ecosystems. Campers were also able to participate in conservation efforts by working with Point Blue's STRAW program to install native plants. This year, we doubled the number of Bay Campers to nearly 100 and, for over 60 percent of them, this was their first summer camp experience! 
